



Dear Friends in the Diocese of San Diego:

Mary and the disciples gathered after the first Ascension Day, constantly devoting themselves to prayer while they waited for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. For centuries, Christians have gathered at that time to pray for the coming of the Holy Spirit.

I invite you to join in a Season of Prayer from June 2, the Sunday following Ascension Day, to June 16, the day following my ordination and consecration as your new bishop. Throughout these 15 days of prayer, let us gather in our communities, the places where we work, live and worship, and within our own hearts, where we can call upon the Holy Spirit to pour out upon this diocese God’s grace and love.

Here in the Diocese of San Diego, I invite you to pray specifically for three things:

- **Growth in discipleship:** that all Episcopalians in our diocese should grow in their relationship with Jesus Christ through worship, learning, and service to others.
- **Evangelism:** that those in our churches, neighborhoods, and communities whose lives would be enriched by the good news of Christ would hear that good news.
- **Serving our neighbors:** that God’s mission in our communities would be empowered as we go out into our neighborhoods, meet the people who are there, become acquainted with their needs, hopes, and longings, and discern our own ministries of service there.
