Celebrating Faith in the Garden

Honoring the intersection of agrarian and liturgical life.

Winter

Advent - The four Sundays before Christmas. Consider using natural elements for your Advent wreaths and using beeswax sheets to make your candles.

Feast of Saint Brigid, February 1 - Eve of February 2, patron saint of cattle, dairymaids, and chicken farmers. A common tradition is to make crosses out of reeds or straw.

Candiemas, February 2, -the halfway point between the winter solutice (Yuie) and the spring equipace (Datra) (des hows as inbolie). Condiens is traditionally a time to have condies blessed that you then use in your home for haly days and feasts. Common foods are creases (a French tradition) or tamales (a Mexicon tradition.)

Saint Abigail, February 11 – patron saint of honeybees and beekeepers.

Spring

Saint Gertrude of Nivelles, March 17- patron saint of cats (including barn and garden cats!)

Easter - Always a wonderful time to celebrate new life, in the garden and in the barnyards.

Rogation Days, three days before Ascension Day These are the major liturgical days that honor agrarian life.

Saint Isidore, May 15, - patron saint of farmers.

Saint Honoré May 16 - patron saint of bakers.

Summer

Corpus Christ, June 8 – the day we hand the bread and the wine, the body and the blood. A good day for bread baking and wine making.

Feast of the Assumption of Mary, ${\rm August}$ $1{\rm S}$ – A wonderful day to hold a Blessing of the Herbs (a tradition harking back to medieval times.)

Autumn

Saint Fiacre, September 1, - patron saint of gardeners.

Hildegard of Bingen, September 17 - Considered by scholars to be the founder of scientific natural history in Germany.

Michaelmas, the Feast of Michael and the Archangels, September 29 - Often tied to autumn rogation days. Michaelmas is often honored with large harvest-themed celebrations, and apple dishes.

Feast of Saint Francis, October 6 - A time to host the Blessing of the Animals.

Saint Martin's Day, November 11 - A day associated with the harvesting of the hags in liberia, and drinking the first of the new wine all over Europe. (It is also a holiday festival in Germany with a lot of fun traditions.)
